EXERCISE 5 – NAVIGATION AND ADVANCED CSS STYLING DUE: CHECK CANVAS FOR DUE DATE. SERVER UPLOAD

In this exercise we will learn several different methods of page navigation. While you are not required to write the CSS code yourself, it is important that you understand how it works and how to adjust the code to suit your needs for you own sites. The styles demonstrated will be:

- CSS Styled Navigation Bars (Horizontal and Vertical)
- CSS Styled Navigation Bars with Drop Down Menus

This page will be created using Dreamweaver CC and should be saved with the name 'exercise5.html' into your 'web_local' folder on your personal laptop or flashdrive. To turn it in – the file will be placed onto the class server (separate handout).

Required elements:

< head> section

Title: Exercise 5

Meta Tags for keywords and descriptions (insert \rightarrow html \rightarrow keywords; insert \rightarrow html \rightarrow description) to add keywords and a brief description to your page. Make sure you insert these into the <head> section below the existing meta tag.

CSS:

- CSS: Appearance (CSS): page font (first box only), size, text color, background color and left and top margins (use at least 20 pixels for margins)
- Links (CSS): "a:link, :visited, :hover, & :active" for link colors and decoration
- Headings (CSS): "h1" tag that is bold (default) and 2 px larger than your normal font size
- Headings (CSS): "h2" tag that is bold (default) and the same size as your normal text

The CSS for the menu bars (/* BEGIN MENU BAR CSS */ through /* END MENU BAR CSS*/) – COPY from my page and adjust for your page. You can leave the comments.

- Colors (fonts, boxes, rollovers) must be different than mine
- Width & height of the boxes must be different than mine
 - Look for /* CHANGE THIS*/ in the style section

The CSS for the drop-down menu bars bars (/* BEGIN DROP_DOWN NAVIGATION*/ through /* END DROP_DOWN NAVIGATION*/) – COPY from my page and adjust for your page. You can leave the comments.
